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SCHOOL SPONSORED STUDENT ACTIVITIES AND OPPORTUNITIES

GUIDANCE:

Character Education (Good Citizens)

Students are recognized for positively modeling the character word for each month. Each student from each homeroom receives a pencil and a certificate. At the end of each month, all of the Good Citizens are eligible for a drawing to become the Student of the Month. This student receives a certificate and gets to shop at the Breezy Hill Curb Market.

Most Improved Students

At the end of each nine weeks, students are recognized for having improved in either grades or behavior. Each student receives a ribbon and a certificate. They enjoy lunch on stage and are given special treats.

K-Kids (A Kiwanis Club sponsored program)

K-Kids consist of a group of fifth graders who are involved in helping with various school-based community projects throughout the school year.

Projects include:

Food drive for Golden Harvest Food Bank, food drive for Aiken County Animal Shelter, volunteered at animal shelter, item drive for the Be A Bunny project, bird food strings, participated in the Graniteville Christmas parade, colors for Costa Rica, and Ronald McDonald House.

How Full is Your Bucket?:

This is a school-wide program where students earn "raindrops" for being kind to others. Raindrops are placed in a classroom bucket. At the end of each month, the teacher draws a name from their bucket to participate in a fun activity. At the end of each nine weeks, the class earning the most raindrops will be treated with a free ice cream funded by the PTO.

Parenting Nights

Byrd has two parenting nights during the school year. Parents are invited to hear teacher presentations on reading and math strategies. After the presentations, the students and parents are treated to a meal.

MEDIA:

Book Fair

Our Media Center at Byrd has two Scholastic Book Fairs per year; one in the Fall and one held in the Spring. There are two parent nights, as well, for each book fair.

Guest Speakers

Students enjoyed several guest speakers: a former missionary for the Inuit of Northern Canada, a local weatherman, and a wood carver. All shared their experiences and skills.

Book Award

Students have an opportunity to participate in the S.C. Children's Book Award program. The nominated books for this award are voted upon by the students throughout the state of S.C.

Good News Club

This is a faith based club sponsored by a local church that students are allowed to attend every Thursday after school.

Looney Tunes Banking

Students learn how to save money by opening a savings account with Security Federal Bank. They are allowed to participate by making weekly deposits.
