## Mission

The mission of Byrd Elementary School is to provide an education by highly qualified professionals that enhances accountability, respect, and self sufficiency through research-based instructional practices, parental involvement, and community support.

## Watch D. O. G. S.

Involving fathers, grandfathers, uncles, and other father figures in the school environment. These men volunteer their time to read and work with students. They join students at recess and lunch. The men are given a schedule to work with teachers to give some support to students and to be actively engaged with the daily routines of the school.

### Character Education (Good Citizens)

Students are recognized for positively modeling the character word for each month. The Good Citizen from each homeroom receives a pencil, certificate & a free kids meal from Chick-fil-A.

### Most Improved Students

At the end of each nine weeks, students are recognized for having improved in either grades or behavior. Each student receives a ribbon and a certificate. They enjoy lunch on stage and are given special treats.

### K-Kids (A Kiwanis Club sponsored program)

### How Full is Your Bucket?:

This is a school-wide program where students earn "raindrops" for being kind to others. Raindrops are placed in a classroom bucket. At the end of each month, the teacher draws a name from their bucket to participate in a fun activity.

### Parenting Nights

Byrd has two parenting nights during the school year. Parents are invited to hear teacher presentations on reading and math strategies. After the presentations, the students and parents are treated to a meal.

### Book Fair

Our Media Center has two Scholastic Book Fairs per year; one in the Fall and one in the Spring. There are two family nights as well, one for each book fair. The Book Fair helps to provide new resources for the Library, as well as, provides funding for books for the Summer reading program.

### Guest Speakers

Students enjoy several guest speakers throughout the school year who share their experiences and skills.

### Good News Club

This is a faith-based club sponsored by a local church. Students are allowed to attend every Thursday after school.

### Looney Tunes Banking

Students learn how to save money by opening a savings account with Security Federal Bank. They are allowed to participate by making weekly deposits. Our fifth graders gain experience by acting as the bankers under a bank representative's supervision.
