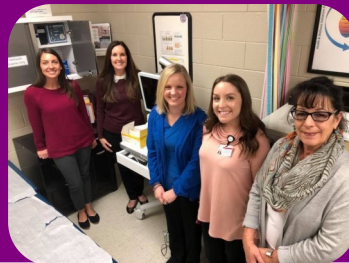

Positive Behavior Supports (PBIS)

PBIS has been implemented this school year at Mary Bramlett. The expectations were put in place for PBIS throughout the building for behavior management and the results are tremendous. There is a 40% reduction in referral rates so far this year. PBIS Celebrations this year were also a success with a 85% attendance rate. Overall PBIS here at Mary Bramlett has been a success.

Response to Intervention (RTI)

In Mary Bramlett's commitment to the success of *all* of our students, we employ the Response to Intervention (RTI) framework. Using individually tailored academic and behavior interventions, we have been able to reduce the number of students needing intervention by 35% in reading alone. First grade saw a 57% reduction due solely to our Reading Recovery program. We continually provide professional development for our faculty and staff to ensure that we are using the most effective evidence based practices.

School Goals

Goal One: By May 2019, 70% of students will be reading on grade level as measured by NSGR.

Goal Two: By June 2019, 100% of teachers will have 65% or more students reading on or above grade level.

Goal Three: By May 2019, a successful school-wide discipline plan will result in having a 50% decrease in office referrals.
