Our motto for the 2012-2013 school year has continued to be "Building a Strong Foundation." The South Carolina Curriculum Standards are the basis for instruction and assessment at Limestone-Central Elementary School. To strengthen the reading and writing foundation for students in grades K-2, two part-time reading interventionists have worked with students this school year.
