Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

Our motto for the 2018-2019 school year continues to be "Building a Strong Foundation." We are also trying to build stronger community by teaching students to "Choose Kindness." Students, parents and staff realize the importance of building a strong foundation. In order to do this, we all work together to meet the needs of all students.

The South Carolina Curriculum Standards are the basis for instruction and assessment at Limestone-Central Elementary School. To strengthen the reading and writing foundation for students in grades K-5, we have had a deep focus on use of Small Group instruction based around the Jan Richardson text, Next Steps Forward in Guided Reading. We also have focused on implementation of small group instruction in mathematics for students in grades K-5, while using Saxon math. This has helped strengthen the academic foundation for students as well.

We also have a strong focus on the Profile of the SC Graduate and Character education as important building blocks in the foundation of our students. We teach and recognize a trait each month, and students participate in character celebrations at the end of each quarter.
