## Evaluation of School Renewal Plan Goals for 2021-2022

### Review of 2020-2021 Strategic Plan Goals

- Parental involvement opportunities will increase to at least two per year, ultimately increasing parents' visits to the school by 20 parents or five per grade level each year.
- By the end of 2024-2025 school year, teacher morale will increase to 4.5 as measured by a teacher survey with a 1-5 Likert Scale.
- By the end of the 2024-2025 school year, all teacher will implement best practices in social emotional education as measured by a decrease of .05% in student behavior per day.
- Increase teachers' ability to implement instructional strategies that facilitate students' critical thinking skills and better utilize questioning as measured by the SCTS 4.0 teacher observation rubric.
- To increase the percentage of students in the "early on grade level" and "mid or above grade level" categories to 65% of all students, as measured by the I-Ready test.
