Curriculum and Instruction

This year the focus at CMS has been on literacy. Each classroom has a library of 150 books that are on individual student's reading levels. Students have 20 minutes each day for independent, self-selected reading. Teachers have been trained to assess students reading levels and to help them set personal reading improvement goals. Students are assessed twice during the year-in fall and spring-and if needed, receive reading and comprehension support in special intervention classes.
