- Great Falls Middle School met 94.1% of Palmetto Assessment of State Standards (PASS) objectives for Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) as defined by federal legislation No Child Left Behind.
- 73.8% of 7th Graders scored Met or Exemplary on 2010 PASS Math.
- 100% of 8th Grade Honors English students received high school credit for English I.
