- FLEX Time at Middle School—Each day students meet in RIT groups based upon their MAP Test results. Teachers of these groups focus on skills identified by NWEA as needing improvement.
- PRIDE Time at High School—Each day students meet in grade level groupings to focus on needed materials.
- DATA—Driven Instruction—Middle School Students have tested 3 times this year through NWEA MAP Testing to gauge progress and determine areas of need. 9th and 10th grade students have also tested to highlight areas of concern as they approach HSAP testing.
