2018 Happenings at LHS

AdvancedEd

The AdvancED accreditation process went well for LHS. Student leadership demonstrated our mission in action. All students spoke well and the AdvancED members had positive things to say about LHS. Department heads were interviewed. All parties involved in AdvancED pointed to LHS's bright future.

Classroom Innovations

LHS has implemented Project Lead the Way creating new engineering, computer science and computer programming courses at Lewisville High School. Lewisville High is also looking to go forward with such efforts by becoming a STEAM certified school. STEAM schools aim to enhance science, technology, engineering, the arts and math. LHS will enhance the visual arts and band programs through this initiative.

Academic Success Recognition

Students on the A and A/B Honor roll were recognized each 9 weeks with goodie bags and treats sponsored by community members and the school.

SAT, ACT, and Ready to Work Assessment

The ACT Plus Writing helps to prepare third year students for future life success. The data will help students and families better understand academic performance, improve graduation rates, and ultimately build a stronger, better-equipped workforce. Students should have their scores at the end of their junior year, which will increase their possibilities of going to college and applying for scholarships and financial aid.

The National Spanish Honor Society

The National Spanish Honor Society is comprised of students who have achieved and maintained an A average for three semesters of Spanish. After joining the society, students travel to Queen City Ballroom in Charlotte to learn salsa, merengue, and bachata dances. They also explore culture through a culinary experience at a local restaurant. The annual event is one that students enjoy and look forward to each year.

ELLE Club

ELLE (Every Lady Lion Empowered) is a new club that formed last year. This club was developed to help promote confidence and empower our young ladies. Ladies attended a make-up session presented by Mrs. Hill. She demonstrated how to have a professional look. This was followed by a session presented by community member Nicki Nash on professional dress for interviews. Sessions were also presented on sex trafficking and self-defense.

Beta Club

LHS Beta Club has 119 members in grades ten through twelve, 42 were inducted this school year. We have worked on service hours by volunteering at a variety of community events such as Lando Days and a local church's roadside trash pickup. Beta Club students will also be volunteering at our yearly CCSD Summer Reading Kickoff.

Academic Challenge Team

The Academic Challenge team finished the regular season with 6 wins and 8 losses. They were Semi-Finalists at the OEC Academic Festival.

LHS Student Council

Lewisville High School's student council includes nine elected officers as well as elected homeroom representatives. The council oversaw homecoming spirit week activities during lunch and at the pep rally which included a powder puff game. Student council kicked off an intramural program students can participate in during lunch. Other activities that kept the council busy included collecting Christmas presents for the Angel Tree Program, coordinating a Red Cross Blood Drive in March, and providing gifts for teachers during Teacher Appreciation week. The officers were members of the student leadership team who met with Mrs. Snipes on a regular basis. Junior and senior officers were also members of the student cabinet. They had the opportunity to meet with Dr. Bain as well as other district office officials to hear current events related to the district as well as voice their concerns as student leaders.

Teacher Cadet

The LHS Teacher Cadet Class is designed to introduce students to the field of education. Cadets gain an appreciation for the teaching profession that will help them to become valuable community members. Each year, cadets complete a field experience at our local elementary and middle schools, participate in College Day at Winthrop University, and volunteer at the SC "End the R Word" Rally and our area Special Olympics.

Interact Club

Lions Interact Club is a new addition to the LHS club family. Founded by seniors Skylar Bogan and Jalen Woodard and sponsored by the Chester Rotary Club, *Lions Interact* fosters community engagement by carrying out service initiatives and providing volunteer opportunities for student members. This year, the club sponsored the "Cozy Sock Drive" for local nursing homes, served dinner to cancer survivors, and revamped this year's Prom Promise campaign. EOC Data

English I, Algebra I, Biology I, and US History courses have state mandated End-of-Course exams at the end of each course and count 20% of the student's final grade.

For the first semester, 113 students were tested. These were our results:

Biology I 69% pass rate

US History 83% pass rate

Algebra I and English 1: Students will test in the spring

For the first semester, testing 113 students, Lewisville High School had a 74% pass rate.

JROTC

The LHS JROTC was evaluated by the JROTC Program for Accreditation (JPA). They received JPA Honor Unit with Distinction. The JLAB Teams advanced to Level II and cadet accomplishments and achievements were recognized at the annual Military Ball.

Concert Band

The Lewisville High School Concert Band competed in SCBDA's Concert Performance Assessment at Nation Ford High School. This event involves preparing music to perform in front of a panel of judges for a rating. Students also had to perform a song they had never seen before for another panel of judges. The Concert Band received the rating of Excellent in All Categories. Congratulations to the Concert Band.

Marching Band

The band has achieved numerous things this year. Our numbers have steadily increased in both concert and marching band. The Marching Band increased in all our scores from last year with a 2nd place in our division at Olde English Festival of Bands and an Excellent rating at Upper State. The Concert Band received an Excellent rating at Concert Performance Assessment this spring. All of our seniors have been accepted into college: Clemson, Converse, & Winthrop.

The Guidance Department

The Guidance Department launched the fall semester with several college access events. We started the year by attending the annual NACROA College Fair at Winthrop University with over eighty colleges from across the Southeast. All seniors had the chance to attend the college fair, a tour of Winthrop University and a tour of the York Technical College. Guidance hosted College Application Day in September where seniors were assisted in applying to colleges by admissions representatives and were given over thirty free application codes. As the FAFSA opened in October, the guidance departments across the district came together to host Scholarship Night and FAFSA Night. Lewisville High School also hosted its own FAFSA Workshop to assist students and parents in completing the FAFSA with the help of financial aid representatives. The Career Expo in October held at The Gateway gave seniors the chance to explore careers and even lead to several internship offers.

In the fall semester, seniors were able to choose between college field trips to Lander University and Erskine College or Coastal Carolina University and Francis Marion University. Students sat in on admissions information, toured campus and ate lunch in the dining hall to get a peek into daily college life. Charter buses were provided by the Furman College Advising Corps to accommodate the longer routes more comfortably. College Adviser Katie Foster from Furman CAC served in her second year assisting guidance events and providing personalized support with the college admissions process.

In November, sophomores toured the Chester County Career Center to learn more about two vocational programs of their choice. This was in preparation for IGP and registration conferences in the spring.

In the spring semester, juniors were able to choose between two college field trips to the University of South Carolina Upstate and Spartanburg Methodist College or Claflin University and the University of South Carolina Columbia. Transportation was paid for by FCAC and students learned about college admissions requirements, toured campus and ate lunch in the dining hall.

Dual enrollment opportunities continue to grow with partnerships with USC-L, York Technical College and Winthrop University. In February, Lewisville High School hosted the first annual CCSD Dual Enrollment Fair, complete with carnival food, for all students and parents to learn about earning college credit while in high school. The 3rd Annual Decision Day will be on May 3rd to celebrate seniors for their military, technical school, career, vocational and college plans post-graduation. Lewisville High School introduced Lion Ambassadors this year to utilize thirty-two of our students to promote our school and develop student leaders. Lion Ambassadors welcome new students to LHS with friendly faces and assist with school events. Our Lion Ambassadors will help with welcoming Lewisville Middle School eighth graders on campus in May for the second year to show them about the opportunities high school has to offer.

Ninety-two seniors are expected to graduate from Lewisville High School on June 8th, 2019.
