#### LHS Receives the 2012-2013 Palmetto Gold Award

At LHS, we are proud of our efforts to increase student achievement and engagement. At present, students in Algebra I/Math for the Technologies II, English I, Biology I and United States History are required to take a state mandated End-of-Course Exam at the conclusion of the course. We continue to make significant gains in the area of EOC Exams with a total passage rate of 87.55% in all subject areas. LHS has been recognized as a Palmetto Gold Award recipient again for the 2012-2013 school year in the area of General Performance. Also in 2012, LHS was one of only five high schools in South Carolina to make 100A on the Federal Accountability measure. We are proud of our increase in the number of sophomore students who pass the High School Assessment Program (HSAP) on the first attempt; we increased to 93.1% passage rate.

The faculty encourages higher student achievement and student responsibility. Each semester, students on the A and A/B honor roll are recognized for their accomplishments. Students have been encouraged to enroll in classes offered at the Chester County Career Center. We continue to offer dual credit through York Technical College, University of South Carolina at Lancaster, and Winthrop University. Teachers continue to offer support and tutoring to all students after school and during lunch.

Through the use of technology, we have significantly improved our communication with parents and the community. We continue to publish a newsletter, but our primary means of communication are our school website, the teachers' websites, the parent portal for student grades and the school Connect phone system. We are also proud to have interactive Promethean boards in all classrooms at LHS. This continues to strive for excellence through the use of technology.

We are also proud of our athletic department this year as we are the home of the IA State Champions in Basketball and the IA Region III champions in softball.

We recognize that everything we do can impact the life of a child, and we strive to make each day a day of growth and learning. Like all schools, we will continue to face the challenges of preparing our students to meet the demands of a global economy.

## Club and Other Activities at LHS

#### **Beta Club**

New members were inducted in November. Service projects during the 2012-2013 year included: *LHS Angel Tree* in which members collected toys, clothes, and other items school-wide in December for children in the Lewisville area. In February, members attended the *USCL Honors Day*. They competed in academic, physical, and arts competitions for scholarships and awards. They were entered into a drawing for an Apple iPad for winning an event at USCL Honors Day and WON! Beta members sold hot chocolate before school to raise money for *Clean Water for Kenya* as well as *reading* to classes at Lewisville Elementary School. Teachers and administrators will be honored in the upcoming weeks during *Teacher and Administrator Appreciation* week.

#### **Junior Civitans**

The LHS Junior Civitan club is a service organization open to all LHS students in grades 9-12. In November, 46 new members were initiated into the club along with 5 new officers for a total of 65 members. School and community service projects this school year included Help a Teacher Day in which returning Civitans came to school on the first Teacher Workday and helped teachers get their classrooms ready for the new school year. A Litter Free Game was sponsored in October at a football game where members gave out trash bags & then collected them after half time. This activity decreased the trash quantity significantly according to the custodial staff. Trick-or-Treat for UNICEF collected \$679.53 to be donated to help children around the world through UNICEF. Members stayed after school during the Campus Clean-up initiative to reduce the trash on campus. Juniors collected 56 toys for the Kool Kids Toy Chest to be placed in the Piedmont Hospital's children's floor toy box. They also participated in World Civitan Day by collecting spare change and painting faces at the Richburg Community Festival for Trick-or-Treat for UNICEF. Members collected 31 blankets for the local nursing home in the Keep the Cold from the Old campaign. For an LHS Christmas, 27 members went Christmas caroling to several businesses and shut-ins in our area. Over 200 items were donated to Operation Care for Afghanistan children and service members. All members will be participating in the Chester County Relay for Life on Friday, May 17th at LHS as they are in charge of the luminaries. Junior Civitans will be electing officers before May 15th & will be accepting new members for 2013-2014 school year. #### LHS Student Council

Student Council participated in three *Student Cabine*t meetings that involved all three district high schools and district office administrators. Meetings included reports on school maintenance, safety, finance reports, various accreditation processes the district is involved in, and collaboration on service projects within and between schools. This year LHS participated in a *Homecoming Spirit Week* in the fall as well as a *Winter Spirit Week* to support our winter sports. Both were successful and had positive student involvement in each week's various spirit days. Student Council raised money through a *carnation sale* to support Teacher Appreciation Week and other council activities. The Council also raised approximately \$50 for a big screen TV in the cafeteria; fundraising will continue next school year. The annual *LHS Blood Drive* in March collected 57 units of blood. Thanks to students, teachers and community members for making this project a huge success. The Council is also collaborating with the Fort Lawn Community Center to create a *community garden* to provide fresh produce to various people in the community.

#### **Teacher Cadets**

The LHS Teacher Cadets have had a great semester. Cadets created big books and read them to students at LES. They also attended College Day at Winthrop University. Before the semester is over, they will complete a field experience in an LES or LMS classroom. Not all of the students want to become teachers, but they have gained an appreciation for the profession that will help them to become valuable community members.

#### **Future Business Leaders of America**

FBLA is a national student organization for students in high schools preparing for careers in business leadership. Our mission is to bring business and education together in a positive working relationship through innovative leadership and career development programs. Currently, FBLA has 19 members. Members attended the *State Fall Leadership Rally* where they participated in various workshops and networked with FBLA members from other districts. #### Mr. Taylor's US History & World History Classes

Last year, Lewisville students had the highest pass rate on the EOC of **any** high school in the state! Their mark of 91.5% beat over 200 high schools, including many charter schools and the two governor schools. Although this was the highest pass rate Lewisville ever had, students during the Fall semester actually improved to 94%. Moreover, *nine* testers made an **A** on the EOC. Going into the Fall semester, only *ten* Lewisville students had made an A during the entire history of the EOC. A number of students have also produced great *family history projects*. One interesting connection was that one student's third great grandfather was a Civil War POW in Point Lookout, Maryland. Mr. Taylor also had a third great grandfather that was a Civil War POW in Point Lookout, Maryland. Both ancestors were captured in the same area of Petersburg, Virginia. Another student discovered that she was a distant cousin of Mr. Taylor.

#### From Guidance Department

The 2012-13 academic year began with the annual Chester County Senior Scholarship Program in September, hosted by the Lewisville High School Guidance Department. This activity was followed by IGP (Individual Graduation Plan) conferences with each senior and his/her parent guardian during the months of September and October. October was also College Application Month and seniors participated in a variety of activities: attending the Regional College Fair at Winthrop University, where over 80 colleges and universities were represented which also included tours of Winthrop and York Tech's Rock Hill campuses. Compass testing was held at York Tech's Chester campus and individual sessions were held with YTC's Beth Darby to discuss the results with students and parents. Sixty-five seniors participated in College Application Day in the LHS lab. Senior Trey McGarity was the Catawba Region winner of an Apple iPAD provided by the SC Commission on Higher Education during College Application Month. Underclassmen IGPs were held from December - February as parents and students met with the school counselor to prepare for graduation and beyond. Two students were named Rotary Students of the Month, Leigh Ann Lehman and Jamie Butler. The LHS faculty voted Jamie Butler as the DAR Good Citizen for Lewisville High School. FAFSA workshop was held in January and scholarship newsletters continue to be sent to the seniors and underclassmen and they are urged to participate in summer opportunities. Lunch with Leaders, funded by a J. Marion Sims Grant, began this year, coordinated by LHS School Counselor Sandy Jordan and CDF Abby Brunson. Community and business leaders meet with students, share a meal, and answer questions about their professions. Speakers are chosen based upon career interested listed on student IGPs. The Chester County School District Career Expo, on May 10<sup>th</sup> at York Tech's Chester Campus, will provide our seniors with an opportunity to explore career and college options available to them as they prepare for graduation. The year's activities culminate with the *Underclassmen Awards Program* June 3<sup>rd</sup> at 2 P.M. and the *Senior Reception and Awards* Program on June 6<sup>th</sup> at 6 P.M.

### **Teacher Awards**


Mrs. Katharine Griffin was selected as the 2013-2014 Lewisville High School Teacher of the Year.
