2015 Happenings at LHS

Microsoft One-to-One Technology Initiative

LHS fully embraced the hiTEC initiative with 100% of our students having the HP Elite tablet to use for their educational needs. Students have access to all Microsoft Office programs and have the ability to store their work on the OneDrive SharePoint cloud so they can have access to their work while at school or from their homes via the internet and have the ability to work collaboratively with each other and with their teachers. The tablets and the free Wi-Fi hot spots around the county, provided by Truvista Communications, allows students to learn and work after school hours.

ACT and WorkKeys Testing

This year HSAP was replaced with the ACT Plus Writing and the ACT WorkKeys tests which will help to prepare 3rd year students for future life success. The data will help students and families better understand academic performance, improve graduation rates, and ultimately build a stronger, better-equipped workforce. Students should have their ACT scores at the end of their junior year, which will increase their possibilities of going to college and applying for scholarships and financial aid. Students can also earn a work-ready certificate, recognized by employers nationwide and linked to the South Carolina Work Ready Communities initiative. World Class Scholars

World Class Scholars is a program designed to link students across the world in a virtual exchange program. Several teachers participate in this program. Ms. Pettibon's first block English I class uses Google Hangouts to chat live with students at Silverline School in Cyprus. The two classes have discovered that while there are many differences between their two cultures, the similarities are more striking. At the heart of it, they have discovered that they are all teenagers thriving in this very important, transitional time in their lives.

Junior Civitans

In November, 16 new members and 5 new officers were inducted for a total of 46 members. School and community service projects include Help-a-Teacher Day, Campus Clean-up, and LHS Christmas Caroling. Members have also planted flowers in the front of the building and painted the light poles in the student parking lot. The club has also started a recycling campaign this year to reduce the amount of cans and bottles in the land field. To date, we have recycled over 1000 bottles and 500 cans. On May 15th, members will participate in the luminary ceremony at Relay for Life to be held in the LHS stadium.

Academic Challenge Team

The Academic Challenge Team finished the Olde English Consortium regular season as Runner-Up with a record of **7-3** as well as Runner-Up in the OEC Academic Festival. Two LHS teams competed in the SC NAQT State Championship at Wofford College, one team finished 7th, the other 14th, and **Lydia Kiley** is currently ranked 26th in the state! The team also competed at the Small School NAQT National Championship in Atlanta, finishing 52nd. **Lydia** is the 14th ranked freshman in the nation and **Hunter Damron** is the 18th ranked sophomore in the nation and 92nd overall in the nation! LHS Student Council

Student council students participated in Spirit Week activities during both fall and winter sports which included a Homecoming Pep Rally and Powder Puff game. The Presidents of each class have participated in the Student Cabinet Forum, who met with district officials to understand the daily operations of the district and to voice their opinion of the school food choices and technology trends. This year's Red Cross Blood Drive collected over **50 units** of blood from students, staff and the surrounding community.

Teacher Cadet

This is the first year there has been two teacher cadet classes – one in the fall and spring semesters! Cadets created big books and read them to LES students. They have or will soon complete their field experience at LES or LMS. LHS Teacher Cadets attended Teacher Cadet Day at Winthrop and The Special Olympics of Rock Hill.
