2015 - 2016 Happenings at LHS

Microsoft One-to-One Technology Initiative

LHS continues to lead the district in the hiTEC initiative with 100% of our students having NEW Lenovo 11e laptops to use for their educational needs. These new laptops have proved to be more beneficial since it has a keyboard and mouse built in while also having a touchscreen. Students have access to all Microsoft Office programs and have the ability to store their work on the OneDrive SharePoint cloud so they can have access to their work while at school or from their homes via the internet. Office 365 also gives students and teachers the ability to work collaboratively with each other in any of the Office products. OneNote Class Notebook has become a staple in LHS classrooms. It is an electronic notebook where students can keep their notes and teachers can distribute notes, videos or any other item the students need in class. The tablets along with the free Wi-Fi hot spots around the county provided by Truvista Communications, and the new Kajeet MiFi devices allow students to learn outside of school even if they do not have internet access at home.

ACT and WorkKeys Testing

This year the ACT WorkKeys was administered to all 3rd year students on March 2, 2016 and the ACT Plus Writing on April 19, 2016. The data from these two assessments will help students and families better understand academic performance, improve graduation rates, and ultimately build a stronger, better-equipped workforce.

LHS held a "Blitz Attack" for the ACT by having 6 sessions of "The 5th Period," where 3rd year students who would be taking the ACT attended 3 English and 3 Math sessions to review topics that would likely be on the ACT. The English department's 5th period instruction addressed reading comprehension, grammar, and test taking strategies. The Math department offered sessions on basic Algebra, Algebra II, Geometry and Trigonometry. Students were encouraged to come up with a game plan to tackle these high stakes exams. Students were also encouraged to set a personal target score.

World Class Scholars

Lewisville High School has completed its fourth semester as participant of Envision SC's participation with World Class Scholars, a virtual classroom exchange program. In the spring semester of the 2015-2016 school year, WCS broke off as an extracurricular activity. The nine participating students have been partnered one-on-one with the nine students at Silverline School in Cyprus. With their partners across the ocean, participants planned and presented presentations to first show a comparison between the two countries. For the May 10th meeting, students were encouraged to think outside the box and get really creative for their presentations. They created vlogs, shared recipes, and even created an itinerary of a trip that they'd go on together. This experience has been amazing for allowing LHS students develop their communication skills and their ability to time manage while planning a presentation. Ms. Katharine Pettibon is the lead teacher for World Class Scholars here at LHS.

Future Business Leaders of America

The mission of Future Business Leaders of America is to bring business and education together in a positive working relationship through innovative leadership and career development programs. Currently, there are 18 student members. Students attended the FBLA District Leadership Conference at Dorman High School this year and competed in Accounting and Impromptu Speaking. Two students, Cecily Melton and Samantha Lovern, qualified for state competition.

Spanish Honor Society

The Spanish Honor Society, directed by Susan Treveiler, inducted eight new members. They went to the Queen City Ballroom and learned Spanish dances and then ate authentic Mexican cuisine at Agave Azul here in Richburg!

Beta Club

LHS Beta Club inducted 35 new members for the 2015-2016 school year. We had the Honorable Judge Brian Gibbons address students in a motivational and encouraging speech welcoming them to the elite membership of Betas. The Angle Tree was once again a success due to the hard work and dedication of the LHS Beta Club. We raised money and provided Christmas gifts for 17 local children. We also visited USCL for the annual Honors Day competitions. Several of our students placed in various categories throughout the day.

Perks for Good Works

LHS Honor Roll students were treated to a breakfast on four occasions during the school year. The LHS library was transformed with soft lighting and soothing music to create a coffee shop environment for all honor roll students. Another service activity included volunteering at Lewisville Elementary School's Media Center, assisting the Media Specialist as well as reading to students during the first semester. Hosting a bus driver appreciation breakfast, as well as teacher appreciation week happenings rounded out the many activities of the LHS Student Council.
