Purpose of Annual Report
Parents and the community are provided a report each year which identifies the school's accomplishments and indicates the progress being made to achieve the goals of the Strategic Plan. The School Improvement Council and principal work together to create this annual report.

## Strategic Plan Results

Performance Goal: Student Achievement
"STAR TIME" was an Intervention Block set aside for 30 minutes during the school day for all students 3 rd through $5^{\text {th }}$ Grades. "STAR Tutoring" was conducted for select students to assist with specific skills identified by Fountas \& Pinnell running record results, math assessments, and MAP results in Reading and/or Math. Promethean Boards are used in every classroom and laptops in every grade. The online programs, Waterford, IXL, Dreambox (K5 to 5th Grades), Reading Eggs (Pre-K
to $1^{\text {st }}$ Grade), and Study Island ( $2^{\text {nd }}$ to $5^{\text {th }}$ Grade) were
purchased by the Chester County School District to assist and enrich student achievement in reading, math, social studies, and science.

## Performance Goal: School Climate

Opportunities for family and community included our Open House, virtual Family Literacy \& Math Nights, Quarterly Awards Programs, school newsletters, and a
SCREADY \& SCPASS Workshop organized by our Literacy \& Math Coaches. Students were recognized for exceptional achievement; Principal Scholars, Honor Roll, STAR Readers, STAR Math Dreamers, SCREADY \& SC PASS Achievement as well as MAP Achievers are just a few of the awards presented throughout the year. An onsite Mental Health Counselor was provided to support students and families through intervention services and a School Counselor. Call Connect messages are sent to families to keep them informed of upcoming events and academic testing.

## Performance Goal: Teacher/Leadership

 Grade Level Data Team Meetings were held weekly for the purpose of analyzing data to review student progress towards meeting grade level standards and to stay current on best practices in education. Teachers also met to plan standards-based instructional lessons. Professional Development Tuesdays were held each week with various foci such as "Literacy Tuesday" \& "Math Tuesday" which are conducted by the Literacy and Math Coaches to provide best practices in ELA \& Math;'G.R.I.T. Tuesday' introduced technology to teachers which was provided by the Technology Liaison; and one

Tuesday each month was used for school-based professional development. Throughout the year, several teachers attended professional development opportunities for various academic subjects or classroom management.
