Purpose of Annual Report

Parents and the community are provided a report each year which identifies the school's accomplishments and indicates the progress being made to achieve the goals of the Strategic Plan. The School Improvement Council and principal work together to create this annual report.

Strategic Plan Results

Performance Goal: Student Achievement

"STAR TIME" was an Intervention Block set aside for the entire school each morning from 8:10-8:40am for all students Pre-k through 5th Grade. "STAR Tutoring" was conducted for select students in Pre-K through 5th Grade to assist with specific skills identified by reading test, math assessments, and MAP results in Reading and/or Math. The Math & Science Showcase gave students an opportunity to solve problems with real-world application of knowledge. Promethean Boards in every classroom, laptops for student use in grades 2 and 4, a portable, classroom set of laptops and wireless tablets were used to increase the use of technology in classrooms. The online programs, Reading Eggs (Pre-K to 1st Grade) and Study Island (2nd to 5th Grade) , were purchased by the Chester County School District to assist and enrich student achievement in reading, math, social studies, and science. Winthrop's NetSCOPE Grant provided funds for Reading A to Z, a computerized reading program, in every classroom. Supplemental materials such as Science and Social Studies Weekly were purchased to correlate with science and social studies instruction. Programs such as Junior Achievement and 4-H Lessons were provided to motivate students and enrich the curriculum.

Performance Goal: School Climate

Opportunities for family and community included parent workshops, Open House, Nine Weeks Awards Programs, biweekly school newsletters, Bring a Parent to School Day and Family Reading & Writing Night organized by our Literacy Coach & Reading Interventionist. Students were recognized for exceptional achievement; Principal Scholars, Honor Roll, My Personal Best, Lollipop Club, STAR Students of the Month, Perfect Attendance STARS, SC PASS Achievement and MAP Achievers are just a few of the awards presented each nine weeks. An on-site Mental Health Counselor was provided to support students and families through intervention services.

Performance Goal: Teacher/Leadership

Grade Level Team Meetings were held weekly for the purpose of analyzing data to review student progress towards meeting grade level standards and to stay up-todate on best practices in education. Teachers also met to plan standards-based instructional lessons. Professional Development was held twice each month after school on Common Core using PD360 as well as "Tech Tuesdays" using new technology. Classroom teachers were provided on-going professional development on using the new math series, *My Math* by Jane White, a math consultant with the company.
