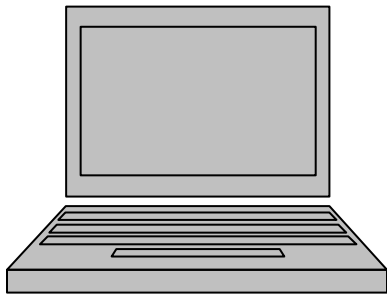


COLT Mission Statement

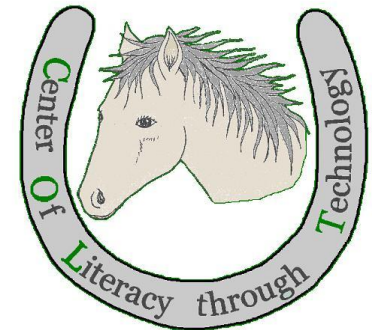

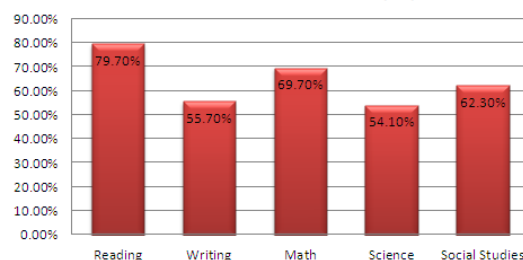

Something to Celebrate!

- **COLT MADE AYP** by having 100% of subgroups meeting the standard through PASS testing!
- **Over \$10,000** in PPG grants received for additional programs/learning tools for students.
- **Participation in several service learning projects** such as Pennies for Patients and Relay for Life. COLT was the top school winner for “Most Spirit” at the Relay for Life event and raised \$2,782.00!
- **Continuation and expansion of technology initiatives** such as laptops/XO’s for students and jumpdrives for 2nd – 5th graders.
- **ACE club offerings** were expanded this year to include Drama and Cheerleading Clubs.
- **Professional Learning Communities** were continued. These groups focused on SC State Standards implementation, best instructional practices, and data analysis.
- 4th and 5th grade students experienced historical overnight field trips. 5th graders visited Washington, DC while 4th graders traveled to Jamestown, VA.
- One literacy interventionist supported reading instruction/learning in grades K – 5.
- A grant was received to support a mentoring program at COLT.
- Our Assistant Principal, Dr. Graham, was selected as Elementary Assistant Principal of the Year by the South Carolina Association of School Administrators
- Our Relay for Life Team met their goal of \$1,500.00 plus contributed to funds to the McKeown family in honor of our Literacy Interventionist, Stacey McKeown.
