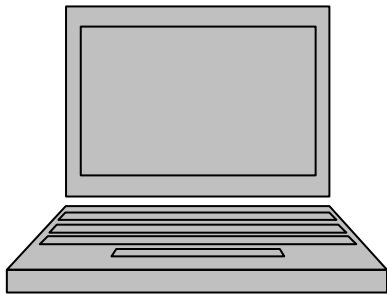


### ***COLT Mission Statement***

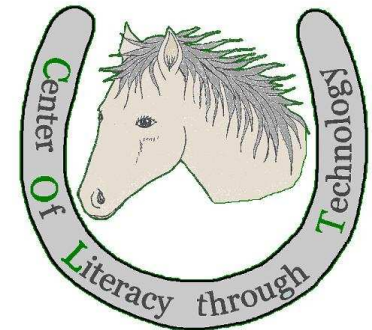

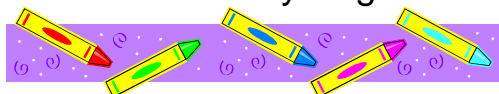

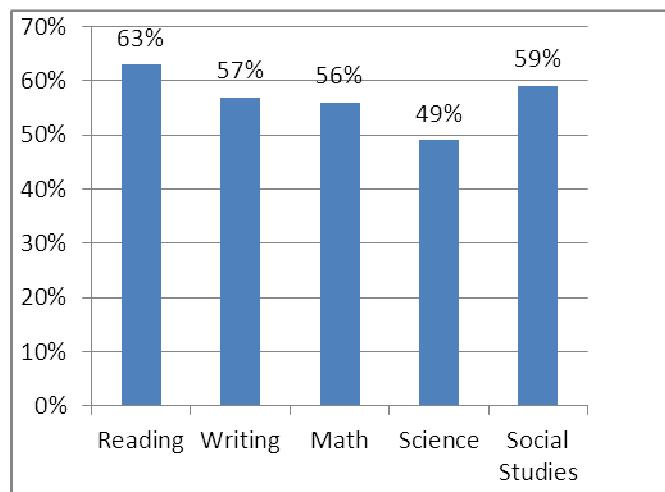

### Something to Celebrate!

- Participation in several service learning projects such as Pennies for Patients and Relay for Life. COLT was the top school winner for "Most Spirit" at the Relay for Life event and raised \$2,782.00!
- Continuation and expansion of technology initiatives such as Ipad and Innotab purchases.
- ACE club offerings were expanded this year to include cooking class, line dance and tap dance.
- Professional Learning Communities were continued. These groups focused on SC State Standards implementation, best instructional practices, and data analysis.
- 5<sup>th</sup> grade students experienced a historical overnight field trips to Washington, DC
- One literacy interventionist supported reading instruction/learning in grades K – 5.
- COLT was awarded the Palmetto Silver Award for three consecutive years of improvement on PASS!
- The first Annual March Madness Technology Night was held at COLT. Each class had a showcase technology project and children's author, Gretchen Kimmer, shared her knowledge of book writing and illustration. Each student attending received a free book by Mrs. Kimmer.
- COLT participated in Founder's Credit Union student saving account program again this year.
- Students were able to participate in an increased number of interesting assemblies such as an antibullying program, The Charlotte Bobcat's Sir Purr PASS program, and a Pennies for Patient Leukemia Awareness Assembly.
