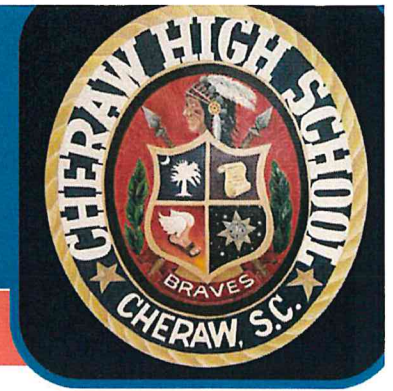

Last year, we had a lot to brag about: the 22-23 class earned over 4.2 million dollars in scholarships. Most of the scholarships were academic, but there were 5 sports scholarships awarded and 1 band scholarship as well. Additionally, the class excelled with 6 associates' degrees earned, 96 career and technical education completions, 39 honor graduates, 11 military enlistments, 23 beta members, 1 SC Teaching Fellow, and a governor school completer.
