Goal 3: The percentage of parents participating in parent/teacher activities that support home/school relations will remain at 100%.

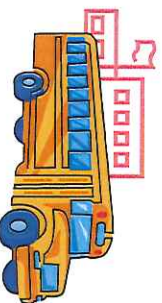
Strategies:

- Provide student achievement and awards.

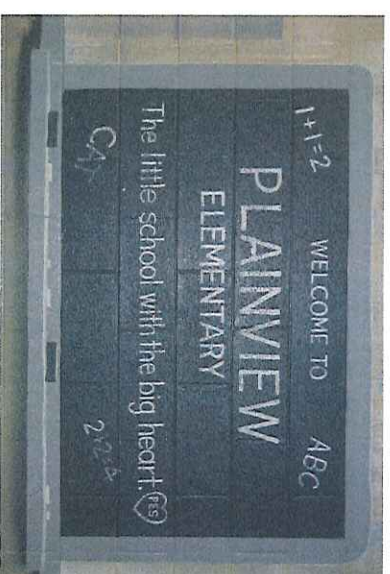
