## Introduction

## **OLWEUS Anti-Bullying Program**

Chesterfield County School District was awarded \$2.46 million over three years to partner with the Chesterfield County Coordinating Council and the Institute on Family & Neighborhood Life (IFNL) at Clemson University to study if two different programs paired with school-based mental health services can contribute to school safety. This anti-bullying program will be taught to all students to help eliminate bullying within the school and community. Plainview kicked off the program with presentations by classes to demonstrate what they had learned about bullying. Through a weekly morning meeting, the students discuss bullying situations and talk about ways to eliminate bullying.

## SIC Goals:

**Goal 1:** The percentage of parents participating in parent/teacher conferences will remain at 100%.

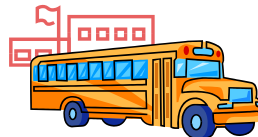
- Contact parents by phone, email or letter if they are unable to come to scheduled conference.

## Additional Information for Plainview

- 54% of teachers have an advanced degree
- Plainview students in grades 3-6 met or exceeded the state average in 18 areas on the ACT Aspire and SC PASS state assessment in 2015.
- Pupil-teacher ratio is 16.5:1  
There are larger classes in some grades due to school structure and the inability to split a grade into two sections.
