

CIS News and Notables

- We are very proud of our students and staff for their hard work and achievement last year. As a result, CIS earned a "GOOD" rating on the school report card.
- The purpose of Title I funds is to support the reading and math programs. These funds were used to hire school interventionists and a regular classroom teacher, implement an afterschool homework program, and support our parent involvement initiative.
- Mrs. Maeghan McLaurin, 3rd grade teacher, was elected as CIS Teacher of the Year for 2020-2021.
- The students participated in several service projects for various charitable organizations which included the McArn Food Bank, March of Dimes, and Jump Rope for Heart.
- CIS hosted the All County Art and Chorus Program. Over 300 students from all over the county participated in the two-day event which culminated in a performance on January 23, 2020.
- CIS retained its Arts in Basic Curriculum (ABC) status and thus received approximately \$10,000 in grant funds.
 These funds were used to purchase new instruments and art supplies and to hire an artist-in-resident to direct the musical, "Jungle Book".
- The Science on the Move program sponsored by 4H and Clemson Extension conducted 2 STEM (Science Technology Engineering and Math) activities with our Afterschool Program.
