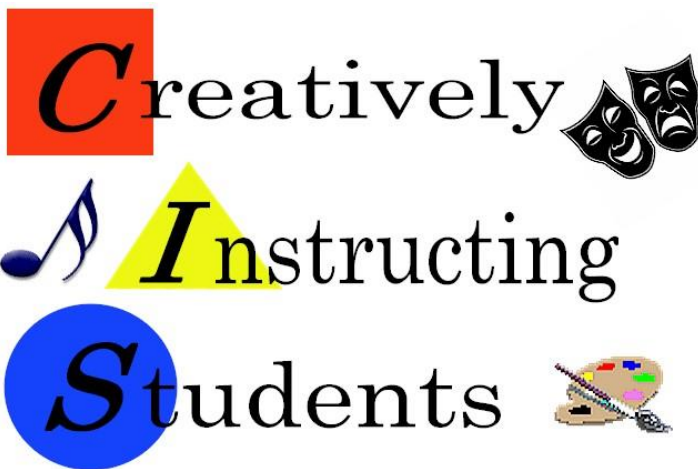
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## Vision Statement

## **School Renewal Goals**

### **Student Achievement Goals:**

1. The percentage of students in grades 3-5 scoring MET or above on reading as measured by MAP will increase from 20% (third grade), 19% (fourth grade) and 14% (fifth grade) in 2020-21 to 45% in 2026-27.
2. The percentage of students in grades 3-5 scoring MET or above on math as measured by MAP will increase from 14% (third grade), 9% (fourth grade) and 8% (fifth grade) in 2020-21 to 40% in 2026-27.
3. The percentage of students in grade 4 who score met/exemplary in SC PASS in Science will increase from 20.6% in 2020-21 to 50% in 2026-27.

**Current Progress:** In 2022-23, the students' spring MAP scores are displayed in the following table.

### **Teacher/Administrator Quality Goal:**

The teacher retention rate, as reported on the school report card, will increase from 80.2% in 2020-21 to 90% in 2026-27.

**Current Progress:** in 2021-22, the retention rate of teachers was 82.6%.

### **School Climate Goal:**

By 2020-21, the percentage of parents satisfied with the home/school relationship, as reported on the school report card, will increase to 91%.

**Current Progress:** in 2021-22, 100% of the parents were satisfied with the home-school relationship.

## **CIS News and Notables**

- CIS is a Title I funded school. The purpose of Title I funds is to support the reading and math programs. These funds were used to hire school interventionists and a classroom teacher, contract with an educational consultant to provide math professional development for all math teachers and support our parent involvement workshops.
- Mrs. Paula Teal, exceptional education teacher, was elected as CIS Teacher of the Year for 2022-23.
- Mrs. Angela Harrison, instructional assistant, was elected as CIS Employee of the Year for 2022-23.
- CIS became an Arts in Basic Curriculum (ABC) certified school and thus received approximately \$12,500 in grant funds. These funds were used to enhance the arts experiences for our students. For example, funds purchased new instruments, art supplies, and iPads, and were used to contract with an artist-in-resident, the Ballie Players, to perform the musical, "Hansel and Gretel" with our chorus students.
- The Governors School conducted STEAM activities with each grade level. The 3<sup>rd</sup> grade students learned about electricity and circuits; the 4<sup>th</sup> grade experimented with light and color; and the 5<sup>th</sup> grade played an eco-system game of tag and launched Alka-seltzer rockets.
- To celebrate our Growth Mindset culture and our students, we had a Growth Spotlight.
