

CIS News and Notables

- CIS received the Palmetto Silver Award for general performance and closing the achievement gap.
- Title I funds were used to support the reading and math programs by hiring school interventionists and a special education coach, purchasing instructional supplies and technology, implementing an after school homework center, and parent workshop supplies.
- Parent workshops were planned monthly and included topics on reading and writing strategies, math strategies and games, and SC Ready testing.
- Tracy Hatcher, 5th grade teacher, was elected as CIS Teacher of the Year for 2016-2017.
- The students participated in several service projects for various charitable organizations which included the McArn Food Bank, March of Dimes, Pennies for Patients, Jump Rope for Heart, and Relay for Life.
- Thirty-seven students were inducted into the CIS chapter of the National Elementary Honor Society.
- Ninety MobyMax tablets were purchased for student use.
- CIS retained its Arts in Basic Curriculum (ABC) status and thus received grant funds that exceeded \$6,000. These funds were used to support the art program for the students and the teachers.
- Four teachers, Mrs. Godfrey, Mrs. Griffith, Mr. Mullins, and Mr. Houser had their Donors Choose projects funded.
