

#### **Student Achievement Performance**

**Goal:** Using the state standardized test scores, the percentage of students scoring "meets" and "exceeds" in ELA, math, science, and social studies will increase to the following levels by 2020-2021.

#### CIS News and Notables

- The purpose of Title I funds is to support the reading and math programs. These funds were used to hire school interventionists and a regular classroom teacher, implement an after school homework center, and provide materials and supplies for parent workshops.
- Parent workshops were planned throughout the school year and included topics on reading and writing strategies, STEM, and SC Ready/SC PASS testing.
- Ms. Destiny Burns, 3<sup>rd</sup> grade teacher, was elected as CIS Teacher of the Year for 2018-2019.
- The students participated in several service projects for various charitable organizations which included the McArn Food Bank, March of Dimes, Jump Rope for Heart, and Relay for Life.
- Forty outstanding students were inducted into the CIS chapter of the National Elementary Honor Society.
- CIS retained its Arts in Basic Curriculum (ABC) status and thus received grant funds that exceeded \$10,000. These funds were used to purchase new instruments for students to use in music class and to purchase art supplies. Funds were also used to supplement the cost of the art students attending ArtFields, Lake City's art festival.
- Elijah Smith, 4<sup>th</sup> grade student in Mrs. Autry's class had a perfect score on the SC Ready Math Test.
- Two art students were recognized. Hailey Boan won the Superintendent's Art Award for all elementary students, and Eva Knowles won an art contest and had her picture published in a wrestling comic book.
