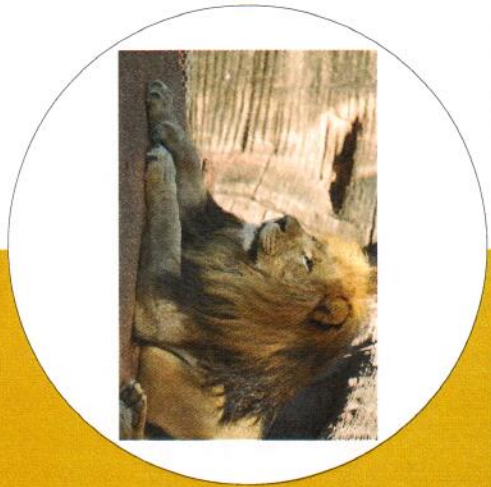

Manning High School continues the alliance with Central Carolina for the College Credit Program. The Early College program began in 2015, and in May 2017, seven High School seniors graduated with an Associate of Arts degree and a high school diploma. We had 25 students enrolled in Dual Credit courses earning 24-68 hours of college credit. These earned credits will transfer to any public or private college in the state of South Carolina and to many colleges outside of the state. In the 2018 graduating class, six seniors will graduate in May and two in the summer with an Associate of Arts degree. Manning High School continues STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) by offering *Introduction to Engineering* and *Principles of Engineering*. The program has been enhanced by new equipment to prepare students for future technology opportunities. Students at Manning High had the opportunity to prepare for the ACT, SAT, EOCEP, Accuplacer, ASVAB and WorkKeys.

The Advanced Placement program continues to grow with the addition of AP U.S. History in 2017-2018. Manning High School is home to the number one FFA program, having led the state of South Carolina with the highest enrollment for 26 years. Our AFJROTC continues to offer opportunities for students, and our Interscholastic Athletic Teams remain competitive in all sports. Our Art and Music Departments are active in regional, state and national events. The students have developed their skills through the collaborative partnership between the Junior High and High School instructors.

The MHS instructional and support staff annually participate in the Summer Academy program. The Summer Academy allows individuals the opportunity to choose professional development topics to meet their individual growth needs.



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
