## SCHOLARSHIP

Our current class of 2015, has the ability to qualify for a 2-year scholarship to Central Carolina. To be eligible for the scholarship, students must graduate on time in 2015 with at least a "C" average, and test ready for college level coursework..

## TEST PREPARATION AND EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

During the 2011-2012 school year, MHS incorporated MAP testing to assess the needs of our students that will take HSAP (Exit Exam) for the first time. The students' test results were used by their teachers to help better prepare them for HSAP testing. Students attended "in school" tutoring 3 days a week and were added to the HSAP Test Prep course. Throughout the year, we also provided special preparedness sessions for SAT, ACT, HSAP, Work Keys, and ASVAB.

We continue to offer a variety of Inter-scholastic Athletic sports along with several prominent clubs and organizations. We completely renovated our tennis facilities and added a varsity soccer team. Organizations like FFA, FBLA, and JROTC continue to compete on the local, state, and national levels.

## FACULTY

The faculty members of Manning High School are working at becoming a Professional Learning Community (PLC). We are still expanding our Career and Technology Education (CATE) curriculum with articulation agreements with F. E. DuBose Career Center and Central Carolina Technical College. We have one staff members this year that is a part of the Teach for America program.
