




# Increase the percentage of kindergarten and first grade students reading on grade level to 80% or higher (Dominie and MAP).




#### Kindergarten Dominie Spring Assessments Percent of Students on Grade Level




#### Begin the NAEYC renewal process.

Increase staff and student attendance to 96% (Report Card Criteria).

#### Student and Teacher Attendance



Provide focused data-driven staff development which promotes the academic growth of students and increases the skills and professionalism of the teachers and paraprofessionals.

Increase the promotion rate to 95% of students in kindergarten and first grade who are ready to make adequate and appropriate progress at the next grade level.



### **Instructional Program**

The instructional program at Manning Early Childhood Center is based on the South Carolina Curriculum Standards, NAEYC Standards, CDEPP Guidelines, and the needs of students. Teachers use the SC Curriculum and state issued adopted textbooks, sets of leveled books, Science and Math manipulatives, and a variety of other materials available. The staff will implement the Common Core State Standards during the 2012 school year. Technology is an integral part of the curriculum. Over 85% of the classes have interactive white boards and classes go weekly to the computer lab using the Waterford and Classworks programs.
