

CCHS Average Daily Attendance

We are proud to see the attendance rate improve after having dropped as a result of the COVID pandemic!

On average, 85.3% of our students attend school each day according to our 135th day report. In the coming school year, our goal will be to achieve 98% Average Daily Attendance.



Student Activities

In addition to ROTC, band, chorus and sports, students also participated in fundraisers, art contests, mentoring initiatives, food drives and after-school tutoring programs.

Student Council:

We held our Homecoming Spirit Week in the fall that included Disney-Themed spirit days, hallway decoration, Homecoming Pep Rally for Fall athletes, and the half time Homecoming Queen presentation. We also organized the Coming Home Spring Spirit Week that included the Cougar Day Pep Rally to recognize Winter and Spring athletes.

So far this year we have also held three school events that benefited the community.

- We raised over \$500.00 for the homeless shelter.
