Our Mission

The mission of Gloverville Elementary School is to prepare all students to become confident, academically proficient, responsible and caring citizens by providing diverse and challenging learning experiences aligned with the state academic standards. Our purpose is premised upon providing a nurturing environment utilizing the learner, school, home, and community.

Gloverville Elementary School is accredited by AdvancEd.

We are a Title I school with an enrollment of 312 students.

Highlights of activities to improve student achievement:

- Future Mustangs Mentors from Midland Valley High School and Read to Read volunteers read to and tutor selected students.
- Reading Interventionists provides instruction to K-5th grade students.
- Pre-K—5th grade students participate in weekly Spanish classes.
- Students in grades 1-5 receive individualized computer instruction in reading and math using Compass Pathblazer.
- Teachers employ writing across the curriculum and implement the District's Literacy Model as a foundation for a balanced literacy program.
- Teachers communicate with parents concerning students' progress through webpages, weekly packets, newsletters, and conferences.
- Teachers use problem-solving materials, critical thinking questioning and hands-on materials to supplement the curriculum in all subjects.
- School Intervention Team analyzes data at the school, classroom, and student level to recommend interventions, professional development, and innovative practices.
- Instructional coach collaborates with teachers and administration in the implementation of SC Career and Ready Standards and Read to Succeed.
