## School Renewal Goal 1

Goal: Gloverville Elementary School will see an increase in student performance in ELA and Math by using a variety of best practices:

- Students will participate in a school-wide reading program using S.T.A.R. reading assessment to set individual goals.
- Grade level teachers will meet weekly to share ideas in developmentally appropriate activities.
- All students will participate in weekly Spanish classes.
- Students in grades 1-5 will receive individualized computer instruction in reading and math through the CAl lab.
- Teachers will employ witing across the curriculum with the use of Thinking Maps and Wite From the Beginning and have students publish writing in a variety of formats.
- Teachers will communicate with parents concerning students' progress through weekly packets and newsletters.
- Language Arts teachers will implement the District's Literacy Model as a foundation for a balanced literacy program.
- Teachers in grades $5 \mathrm{~K}-4$ will supplement their math program with Saxon Math.
- Teachers will implement SC standards as their curriculum
- Teachers will increase the utilization of problem-solving materials critical thinking software, and hands-on math manipulatives to supplement the math curriculum
- Instructional aides will be assigned in all grade levels for language arts and math instruction.
- School Intervention Team will analyze data at the school, classroom, and student level to recommend interventions, professional development, and innovative practices.

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## School Renewal Goal 2

Goal: GES will maintain $100 \%$ of all teachers as highly qualified; all administrators will meet certification requirements and demonstrate proficiency on their evaluation instruments.

- Teachers and administrators will participate in on-going staff development and training in best practices, assessment, technology, and student intervention.
