School Renewal Goal 1

Goal: By Spring of 2014, 90% of our students will score Met or Exemplary levels in both math and ELA as measured by PASS.

Strategy 1: Increase student performance by using a variety of best practices.

Strategy 2: Provide academic intervention for students

Activities include:

- Students participate in a school-wide reading program using Dominic and S.T.A.R. reading assessment to set individual goals.
- Grade level teachers meet weekly to collaborate, plan lessons, and analyze student data.
- All students participate in weekly Spanish classes.
- Students in grades 1-5 receive individualized computer instruction in reading and math through the CAI lab.
- Teachers employ writing across the curriculum and implement the District's Literacy Model as a foundation for a balanced literacy program.
- Teachers communicate with parents concerning students' progress through weekly packets and newsletters.
- Teachers in grades 5K—4 supplement their math program with Saxon Math.
- Teachers implement CCSS standards as their curriculum.
- Teachers increase the utilization of problem-solving materials, critical thinking software, and hands-on materials to supplement the curriculum in all subjects.
- New Ipads provided for all classrooms and new projectors purchased to replace old ones.
- Instructional aides are assigned in 2nd - 5th grade.
- School Intervention Team analyzes data at the school, classroom, and student level to recommend interventions, professional development, and innovative practices.
- Instructional coach collaborates with teachers and administration in the implementation of Common Core State Standards and Aiken County Curriculum Guide.
- Leadership Team establishes common goals and incentives in order to assist in the implementation of Common Core State Standards.

School Renewal Goal 2

Goal: GES will maintain 100% of all teachers as highly qualified; all administrators will meet certification requirements and demonstrate proficiency on their evaluation instruments.

Strategy 1: Ensure that all teachers continue to meet highly qualified criteria.

Strategy 2: Provide high quality and on-going staff development for administration and all instructional staff.
