

Parents Right To Know

Parents have the right to be informed about their child's teacher's qualifications at schools receiving Title I funding. Specifically, you have the right to know:

- Whether the teacher meets state qualifications and licensing standards for the grade levels and subject areas they instruct.
- If the teacher is teaching under an emergency or provisional status that waives state qualification or licensing criteria.
- The teacher's major in their baccalaureate degree, as well as any additional graduate certifications or degrees they hold, include their fields of study.
