The organization and authority of the School Improvement Council (SIC) are outlined in the 1977 Education Finance Act. Its responsibilities were expanded in 1984, 1993 and 1998 to include the information in this *Report to the Parents*. The purpose of this annual report, which is required by law, is to inform the community about the current status of education at Hartsville High School, as well as the plans for improvement.

The School Improvement Council is scheduled to meet monthly in conjunction with the Hartsville High School Academic Booster Club, and public participation is encouraged and welcomed. Any topic of interest or concern is appropriate and open to discussion, and participants are afforded the opportunity to ask questions of and offer input to the principal or his designee. Items that have been discussed in the past include the International Baccalaureate Programme, the physical facilities of the school, master schedule and curriculum issues, the School Report Card and AYP data, school safety and security, and incentives for academic achievement. The overarching goal of the School Improvement Council is to continue to improve the collaborative working relationship between the school, parents of our students, local business and industry and the community. ## Hartsville High School Gives Back to The Hartsville Community
