Its responsibilities were expanded in 1984, 1993, and 1998 to include the information in this *Report to the Parents*. The School Improvement Council is scheduled to meet monthly in conjunction with the Hartsville High School Academic Booster Club, and public participation is encouraged and welcomed. ## Hartsville High School Gives Back to the Hartsville Community

The Hartsville High School Red Fox Family understands the importance of community support, and in turn, does many things to give back to the Hartsville community. Our clubs and organizations' effort to support the community were canceled or scaled back due to safety concerns related to the COVID-19 virus. However, many of our students were still able to make substantial contributions to make our community a better place. The many service projects in which Hartsville High School clubs, organizations, and teams participated include the following:

- IB students, in conjunction with Hartsville City Council and community members, completed more than 100 combined volunteer hours at the historical Marion Avenue Cemetery.
- Psychology students and Beta Club students sponsored three Red Cross Blood Drives during which over 300 units of blood were collected.
- The National Honor Society (NHS) sponsored thirty-one foster children in the Pee Dee area through Lutheran Services at Christmas. NHS students provided them with toys, toiletries, and candy.
- NHS supports the Trent Hill Center with a yearly silent auction.
- The Hartsville High School National Honor Society collected blankets and donated them to residents at a local assisted living facility.
- Mr. HHS participants raised over \$200 for the Dylan Adams Endowment for Pediatric Cancer.
- Miss HHS participants raised over \$5,000 for the Dylan Adams Endowment for Pediatric Cancer.
- Beta Club members completed more than a combined 1,000 service hours.
- Hartsville High School has a Red Fox Food Pantry that sends weekend meals home to students in need.
