- Ryan Sturgill was selected to attend the SCBDA All-State Band Clinic in Greenville, SC.
- The Hartsville High School Wind Ensemble earned a Superior rating at the 2018 SCBDA Concert Performance Assessment competing in Grade V out of VI.
