2019-2020 HHS Honors and Accomplishments



Its responsibilities were expanded in 1984, 1993 and 1998 to include the information in this Report to the Parents. The School Improvement Council is scheduled to meet monthly in conjunction with the Hartsville High School Academic Booster Club, and public participation is encouraged and welcomed. Hartsville High School Gives Back to the Hartsville Community
