Teachers are given all necessary training to ensure they have the knowledge needed to implement the school's core curriculum.

Our school received an excellent rating on the State Report Card for the 2013-2014 school year. However, our school does gather, analyze and use assessment data in ELA, math, science and social studies to address individual needs of students.
