Our 2010-2011 Interim Performance Goals

1. The percentage of students scoring Met and Exemplary in ELA will increase to 50% as measured by PASS.
 - Met this goal in 3rd, 6th, and 8th (see table)
 - Received a value added score of "3" for student achievement in the TAP model
2. The percentage of students scoring Met and Exemplary in Science will increase to 15% as measured by PASS.
 - Met this goal in all grades (see table)
3. The percentage of students scoring Met and Exemplary in Social Studies will increase to 15% as measured by PASS.
 - Met this goal in all grades (see table)
4. The percentage of high quality teachers will increase to 100% as reported in our school report card.
 - Implemented Nationally Renowned Teacher Advancement Program(TAP) for the 5th year
 - Maintained 100% high quality teachers
5. The percentage of parents and teachers satisfied with the learning environment will increase to 87.3% as measured by report card surveys.
 - Results of parents surveyed were as follows: 70% satisfaction with the learning environment, 100% school-home relations, and 70% the physical and social environment.
 - Continued to implement athletics and extra- curricular activities such as band, running club, academic challenge, boy's basketball, cheerleading, and Jr. BETA for students and parents to participate and generate school pride
 - Attended State Jr. BETA Convention
 - Participated in National Network of Partnership Schools
 - Awarded Clean School of the Month award for Division I Schools
 - 100% of our parents attended parent-teacher conferences
 - 75.8% of our teachers returned from the previous year
