### More Data

- Our daily attendance rate was 87.2% in 2012-2013.
- 65% of our 5k-2 graders read or above grade level as measured by Dominix at the end of the year.
- Received \$3000 grant from \_\_\_\_\_ to build classroom library of science and social studies nomenclature in grade 3.
- Several teachers received Domarochowicz grants to provide special projects in media center, ML math and ELA and elementary math. Average award is \$3000.00.

## Our 2012-2013 Interim Performance Goals

- The percentage of students scoring Met and Exemplary in ELA will increase to 50% as measured by PASS.
  - Met this goal in all grades (see table)
  - REMS met AYP/ESEA for 2013 with a 73.9 composite score.
  - Earned an average absolute rating on our 2013 Elementary State Report Card.
  - Earned a below average absolute rating and an excellent growth rating on our 2013 Middle School State Report Card.
- The percentage of students scoring Met and Exemplary in Science will increase to 60% as measured by PASS.
  - Met this goal in 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> grades (see table)
- The percentage of students scoring Met and Exemplary in Social Studies will increase to 60% as measured by PASS.
  - Met this goal in all grades except 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> (see table)
- The percentage of high quality teachers will increase to 100% as reported in our school report card.
  - Implemented Nationally Renowned Teacher Advancement Program (TAP) for the 6<sup>th</sup> year
  - Maintained 100% high quality teachers
  - Home of District Teacher of the Year 2012-13
- The percentage of parents and teachers satisfied with the learning environment will increase to 87.3% as measured by report card surveys.
  - 86.7% of surveyed parents reported satisfaction with the learning environment, school-home relations, and the physical and social environment.
  - Continued to implement athletics and extra-curricular activities such as running club, boy's basketball, cheerleading, and Jr. BETA for students and parents to participate and generate school pride
  - Attended State Jr. BETA Convention
  - 100% of our parents attended parent-teacher conferences
  - 77.1% of our teachers returned from the previous year
