

Guided Reading and Math Flexible Grouping

During the 2022-23 school year, we took a closer look at refining our Guided Reading structures and implementing Math Flexible Groupings to increase students academic achievement in ELA and Math as well as build teachers' capacity in providing data driven standards based lessons that are aligned with our district's instructional framework and our major school priorities. Teachers participated in weekly Collaborative Planning Meetings and Professional Development sessions to explore and refine structures to promote students' success. We engaged in Guided Reading instructional implementation and differentiated Math Instruction dialogue linked to data analysis to ensure we are addressing students' academic needs on-going. . Each instructional component was consistently reviewed, modeled and monitored for effectiveness.

To ensure effective communication between home and school, we met with parents during Pastries with the Principal to discuss the components of Grading Triangulation, Guided Reading, Math Flexible Grouping and the Articulation Process. We continue to analyze data on-going and provide daily instruction that will meet the specific needs of all learners at Hammond Hill Elementary School.

Goal

The goal of our School Improvement Council is to provide ways to improve our instructional practices in reading and mathematics. SIC in collaboration with the school's administration and PTO engaged in meaningful dialogue around Guided Reading Implementation, Data Analysis and Flexible Grouping to build teachers' capacity and increase students' overall academic performance as measured by MAP, SCReady and teacher created assessments.
