THE PURPOSE OF THE REPORT

The purpose of this report is to provide our parents and community with information about the school's progress towards the achievement of its educational objectives of success for all students.

The Year 2011-2012

The 2011-2012 school year was an exciting one for our school community. Our motto, "We Strive for Excellence" became a reality when our school received an overall rating of "Excellent" on our school report card, as reported by the South Carolina State Department of Education. Our improvement rating of "Good" was also noteworthy, and we owe the accomplishment of this goal to high quality instruction from our teachers, focused effort of our students, and unending support from our parents and community.



Performance Objective: By the third grade, 80% of all students will score at the met or exemplary level in English/Language Arts.

Improvement in students' reading skills was again the focus of English/Language Arts (ELA)objectives. Washington Street Elementary continued to implement instructional best practices in English/Language Arts which included the following:

- District professional development
- Continued Reading First practices
- Professional study groups
- Targeted instruction in vocabulary and comprehension skills
- Dominie Reading Assessment
- Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) Assessments
- Small group instruction

PASS results for third grade students revealed a significant increase in student achievement in reading, particularly in the number of students achieving scores at the "exemplary" level. We believe that this improvement occurred because of the diligent effort of teachers and students to master ELA standards set forth by the state of South Carolina.
