Darlington High School has experienced a banner year academically and athletically. We are truly "in the pursuit of excellence." Our school strives to meld academic and technical studies while ensuring that every course is challenging and engaging.

In addition to excelling academically, Darlington High School has made great strides outside of won Region 6AAA championship Cross Country team won the region for the 3rd straight year.

Darlington High School had multiple all-state and all-region athletes. numerous region championships, a Lower-State Championship in basketball, and many student athletes sign to play collegiate sports next


