Purpose of the Report


"This Report is issued by the Darlington County Institute of Technology's School Improvement Council in accordance with South Carolina law to share information on the school's progress in meeting various goals and objectives, the work of the SIC, and other accomplishments during the school year."

SIC ANNUAL GOALS

- 1. Increase number of business, industry, and community partners by 10%. Working with local business, industry, and community partners improves the efficacy of the school to work pipeline.
- 2. Increase the percentage of students earning industry credentials by 10%. Having industry credentials in addition to a completer certificate increases employability of students.
- Increase technical skill attainment to 99%.
 Providing motivation to students to improve their technical skills provides a better prepared workforce for the community.
- 4. Increase school completion to 99.5%. Achieving a diploma, state certificate, or GED is an important step in student's being prepared to enter the world of work.
- 5. Increase student graduation rate to 99%. Students with a high school diploma increase their employability.
- 6. Increase placement rate to 100%. The value of an education is in ensuring that individuals are able to contribute to society upon adulthood. Emphasis is placed on locating apprenticeship, education, or employment opportunities that enable students to be placed after graduation.
- Increase non-traditional participation to 15%. Efforts are made to find non-traditional role models to speak to students and to improve ways to market our programs to future students.
- 8. Maintain non-traditional completion at 100%. Support of students in non-traditional classes is vital to their success.

ENROLLMENT BY GRADE AND SCHOOL



Students from Darlington County School district's four high schools attend the Darlington County Institute of Technology (DCIT) for 2 periods at a time. They are on our campus for approximately 2 hours and 40 minutes a day and receive 2 credits. Darlington High School has the largest percentage of students (44.4%). The percentages for the other schools are as follows: Hartsville High School (40.6%), Mayo High School (9.5%) and Lamar High School (5.5%).

Juniors represent the largest number of DCIT students with 47.9%. Seniors represent 32.3% of our students and sophomores represent 19.4% of our population. Approximately 57% of the students are male. Twenty-three students are enrolled in programs that are considered non-traditional. This represents approximately 8.75% of the potential students in these programs. Efforts are underway to increase total and nontraditional enrollment.
