## SIC ANNUAL GOALS

**Goal 1:** Increase the percentage of home school administrators and school counselors that are knowledgeable at DCIT's pathway offerings to 100%. Continuing to strengthen this relationship increases student exposure to DCIT.

**Goal 2:** Increase the number of students by 15% in pathways not at capacity.

**Goal 3:** Increase community awareness of DCIT and its pathway opportunities.

## HIGHLIGHTS & HONORS

- ▶ Health Science students now have the opportunity to pursue certification as a Certified Clinical Medical Assistant (CCMA) and a Certified Electrocardiogram Certification.
- ▶ Based on local and state workforce demand, DCIT began a new pathway, Mechatronics, this year.
- ▶ A Digital Art & Design student placed first at the South Carolina SkillsUSA competition in the Advertising Division.
- ▶ Nine Health Science students became the first cohort to earn their Certified Electrocardiogram Certification.
- ▶ Two Electricity students placed second and third in the South Carolina SkillsUSA competition in the Electrical Construction Wiring Division.
- ▶ Information Technology students placed first and third in the Carnegie Mellon Computer Science Academy Creative Task Competition.
- ▶ Two students participated in the Harbor Freight Fellows Program.
- ▶ Sixteen students held internships.
- ▶ Students earned over 1,400 industry certifications.
- ▶ Six students attended the South Carolina HOSA State Leadership Conference. One member placed fourth in the Behavioral Health Competition and another was elected as the HOSA Community Liaison.
- ▶ Faculty, staff, and students participated in a Random Acts of Kindness Day by spending a day volunteering and collecting donations for the Humane Society.

The Darlington County Institute of Technology educates and empowers students across the district in preparation for post-secondary success. With over 20 pathways, students are able to discover talents, interests, and skills in a variety of areas.
