

Goals and Strategies for Improvement for 2013-2014

1. Pilot the new South Carolina Teaching Standards (SCTS) model to allow teachers to gain knowledge related to state expectations for student and teacher growth.
2. Continue collaborative groups to refine curricula as well as design formal and informal assessments that reflect the higher levels of the revised Bloom's Taxonomy.
3. Plan and implement the High Schools That Work model to provide focus on student achievement and school improvement.
4. Provide HSAP preparation classes for juniors and seniors who have not passed either or both ELA or Math subtest.
5. Provide an after-school tutorial program to assist students in passing state tests and with extended time to complete course requirements.
6. Develop department actions plans aimed at improving student performance, discipline, and attendance based on the analyses of assessment and demographic data.
7. Refine pacing guides, common lesson plans, and common assessments for each course based on the revised Bloom's Taxonomy and the Common Core Standards.
8. Continue to use the Measure of Academic Performance data to drive instruction and determine scheduling.
9. Develop a credit retrieval plan using A+ Learning to provide alternatives to students who require extended time to earn credits toward graduation.
10. Continue to use GATOR PRIDE incentive program to reward academic performance, attendance, wellness, and success.
11. Provide professional development opportunities for teachers in content, assessment, methodology, and technology.
12. Establish lines of communication with parents through School Messenger, Ed-Line WebPages, weekly telephone calls, and conferences.

It is the mission of Lake View High School to develop life-long learners and responsible, productive members of society by providing academic, social, and emotional skills through cooperation of school and community. With this mission as the center piece, LVHS is proud to present to parents, teachers, students, and community members the SIC annual report.

Lake View High School serves academically and athletically talented students in grades 6 through 12. Mr. Edison Arnette, a seasoned leader of 22 years, is the principal. Under his leadership, Lake View High School has climbed the ladder of success. Lake View High School has been the recipient of the impressive Palmetto Gold Award six times and last year LVHS received a B rating with a score of 83.1 according to the ESEA Federal Accountability System. With a focus on rigor, relevance, and relationships, Lake View High School will continue its commitment to enhance and improve the academic performance of each and every student.

Curriculum planning and the implementation of standards based instruction has continued to positively impact student achievement. A comprehensive testing plan for the 2012-2013 school was developed using data from state and district mandated tests; MAP, HSAP, EOC, SCPASS, SAT, and ACT. Programs were also implemented to assist at-risk students (Tutoring, Mentoring, Tier 2 Keytrain-Workeys Programs, PAXIN Program, and Trinity Behavior Specialist). Lake View High School has also provided Scholarship and Financial Aide Workshops for students and parents.
