

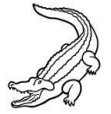
Goals and Strategies for Improvement for 2012-2013

1. Continue collaborative groups to refine curricula as well as design formal and informal assessments that reflect the higher levels of the revised Bloom's Taxonomy.
2. Plan and implement the High Schools That Work model to provide focus on student achievement and school improvement.
3. Provide HSAP preparation classes for juniors and seniors who have not passed either or both ELA or Math subtest.
4. Provide an after-school tutorial program to assist students in passing state tests and with extended time to complete course requirements.
5. Develop department actions plans aimed at improving student performance, discipline, and attendance based on the analyses of assessment and demographic data.
6. Refine pacing guides, common lesson plans, and common assessments for each course based on the revised Bloom's Taxonomy and the Common Core Standards.
7. Continue to use the Measure of Academic Performance data to drive instruction and determine scheduling.
8. Develop a credit retrieval plan using A+ Learning to provide alternatives to students who require extended time to earn credits toward graduation.
9. Create a student GATOR PRIDE incentive program to reward academic performance, attendance, wellness, and success.
10. Provide professional development opportunities for teachers in content, assessment, methodology, and technology.
11. Establish lines of communication with parents through School Messenger, Ed-Line WebPages, weekly telephone calls, and conferences.

LVHS SIC's mission is to serve as a school advisory council that involves parents and community members who will support and assist the school's administration and teachers in their innovative efforts to improve the overall quality of the school for students.

It is the mission of Lake View High School to develop life-long learners and responsible, productive members of society by providing academic, social, and emotional skills through cooperation of school and community. With this mission as the center piece, LVHS is proud to present to parents, teachers, students, and community members the SIC annual report.

Lake View High School has academically and athletically talented students in grades 6th through 12th. At the end of the summer of 2012 the renovations for the new middle school and media center were complete. The teachers and students of grades 6th through 8th were able to move into a brand new facility.

The faculty and staff are committed to build rigor, relevant, and positive relationships to enhance student learning. Curriculum planning and implementation of standards based instruction was continued to guide student achievement. A comprehensive testing plan for the 2012-2013 school was developed using information from MAP, HSAP, EOC, PASS, SAT, and ACT data. The following programs were implemented to assist at-risk students (Tutoring, Mentoring, Tier 2 Keytrain-Workeys Programs, PAXIN Program, and Trinity Behavior Specialist). There were Scholarship and Financial Aide Workshops for Students/Parents.
