Goals and Strategies for Improvement for 2017-2018

- 1. Continue the new South Carolina Teaching Standards (SCTS) model to allow teachers to gain knowledge related to state expectations for student and teacher growth.
- Continue the South Carolina Teaching Evaluation process with the use of Student Learning Objectives which are content-specific, grade level learning objectives that are measureable, focused on growth in student learning, and aligned to curriculum standards.
- 3. Continue collaborative groups to refine curricula as well as design formal and informal assessments that reflect the higher levels of the Depth of Knowledge.
- 4. Plan and implement an 8th grade end of the year induction program, "Sub-Freshman Night", to introduce parents and students on the requirements for high school.
- 5. Continue to use the Measure of Academic Performance (MAP) data to drive instruction and determine scheduling; including enrichment mathematics and reading classes.
- 6. Continue with the current credit retrieval plan using A+ Learning to provide alternatives to students who require extended time to earn credits toward graduation.
- 7. Continue to use a GATOR PRIDE incentive program to reward academic performance, attendance, wellness, and success.
- 8. Provide professional development opportunities for teachers in content, assessment, methodology, and technology.
- 9. Establish lines of communication with parents through School Messenger, Ed-Line WebPages, Peachjar, weekly telephone calls, and conferences.
- 10. Align the curriculum, including STEM classes, to include World Class Knowledge, World Class Skills, and Life & Career Characteristics to ensure that students will meet the goals set forth on the *Profile of the South Carolina Graduate*.
