Lake View Elementary Highlights

- An Individualized Instructional Plan was designed for every student through the Compass
 Learning Program, based on the students' MAP test score data. Compass Learning is a web
 based program, and therefore students can access their individualized plan at home.
- Students are now served free breakfast in the classroom every morning. This ensures all students begin their school day with a nutritious breakfast and will enable them to perform at their maximum potential for learning.
- The Library continues to conduct Library Late Night once a month. Parents and students may come in and use the computers to conduct research or check out books together.
- The Sonday Reading program is utilized to provide early reading intervention for students.
- The Lets Play Learn Reading program is used universally in all 5K classrooms to reduce the number of reading interventions needed in higher grades.
- Science Kits are used in grades 3 and 4 to enhance the science curriculum.
