School Improvement Council Annual Act 135 Summary Report

The mission of the Lake View Elementary School Improvement Council is to serve as a school advisory council. The SIC consists of parents and community members who will support and assist the schools' staff to improve the overall quality of the students' educational success. Lake View Elementary School provides a positive culture and climate where every student can explore and expand their talents.

Curriculum planning and the implementation of standards-based instruction has continued to positively impact student achievement. A comprehensive testing plan for the 2023-24 school year was developed using data from state and district mandated tests: PALS, KRA, iReady, SC Ready, and SCPASS. Lake View Elementary uses diagnostic student data from iReady testing to design an individual learning plan for each student. Students work on their individual plan using iReady, an online assessment and instruction program that helps teachers provide all students a path to proficiency and growth in reading and mathematics. Programs were also provided, with interventions, to assist at-risk students: tutoring, mentoring, and the 21st Century Grant (Save the Children In/After School Program). Lake View Elementary School's Title One and PTO provided several family nights to assist students and parents.

Lake View Elementary School serves students in grades 4K through 5th grade who have talents to be nurtured, cultivated, and developed. Mrs. Tamara Nance-Bethea is the principal. With a focus on rigor, relevance, and relationships, Lake View Elementary School will continue its commitment to enhance and improve the academic performance of every student. The number one goal to give every student the necessary tools that will promote, encourage, and support academic and social growth.

Goals and Strategies for Improvement

- Continue the South Carolina Teaching Standards (SCTS) model to allow teachers to gain knowledge related to state expectations for student and teacher growth.
- Continue the South Carolina Teaching Evaluation process with the use of Student Learning Objectives which are content-specific, grade level learning objectives that are measurable, focused on growth in student learning, and aligned to curriculum standards.
- Continue collaborative groups to refine curricula as well as design formal and informal assessments that reflect the higher levels of the Depth of Knowledge.
- Continue to correlate ELA and math iReady and state testing data to determine specific ELA and math standards strengths and weaknesses.
- Continue to use a PBIS program to reward academic performance, attendance, safety, and positive behavior.
- Provide professional development opportunities for teachers in content, assessment, methodology, safe and healthy school, and technology.
- Provide parents with opportunities to meet/speak with staff members during reasonable hours and to participate in school activities.
- Establish lines of communication with parents through School Messenger, Peachjar, weekly telephone calls, conferences, notes, and school website.
- Implement social and emotional support in classes to improve outcomes for the whole child.
- Continue to implement the Multi-Tiered System of Support (MTSS) for all students. MTSS will be used to improve Tier 1, Tier II, and Tier III instruction for all students and to problem-solve for students who need additional support academically, socially, and or emotionally.
- Provide additional instruction as needed/or requested by students and parents (EL services, exceptional children's programs, in-school tutoring, etc).
- Provided all students with one-to-one devices to assist with online instruction.
- Develop department actions plans aimed at improving student academic performance, discipline, and attendance based on the analyses of assessments and PowerSchool data.
- Plan and implement a 5th grade end of the year promotion program.
 - Field Trips, to explore and expose students to academically enriched activities that promote student learning and growth.
 - Dance, to promote and celebrate positive behavior and academic success.
 - Promotion Night, to introduce parents and students to the requirements for middle school and celebrate student achievements.
