### **Lake View Elementary Accomplishments**

- In August 2012, Lake View Elementary was named a Title One Reward School for academic performance.
- Lake View Elementary has been named a Palmetto Silver or Palmetto Gold School for the last six years in a row.
- On the 2012 School Report Card, Lake View Elementary received an Absolute Rating of Average and a Growth Rating of Good. Under the ESEA/Federal Accountability Rating System, Lake View Elementary received an A Rating.

### **Lake View Elementary Highlights**

- An Individualized Instructional Plan was designed for every student through the Compass Learning Program, based on the students' MAP test score data. Compass Learning is a web based program, and therefore students can access their individualized plan at home.
- Students are now served free breakfast in the classroom every morning. This ensures all students begin their school day with a nutritious breakfast and will enable them to perform at their maximum potential for learning.

- The Library continues to conduct Library Late Night once a month. Parents and students may come in and use the computers to conduct research or check out books together.

### **School Goals for 2011-2012**

**\*These goals were set by Lake View Elementary. Although we did not meet the set goals, we still scored higher in every subject area than state elementary schools with students like ours as reported by the SC Annual School Report Card.**

The following goals were identified in the School Renewal Plan for the 2012-2013 School Year:

- 75% of our students will score Met or Exemplary in English Language Arts as measured by PASS.
- 80% of our students will score Met or Exemplary in Math as measured by PASS.
- 70% of our students will score Met or Exemplary in Science as measured by PASS.
- 83% of our students will score Met or Exemplary in Social Studies as measured by PASS.

The following goals were identified by the Principal and Teachers for the 2012-2013 School Year:

- The number of students showing strength in the area of reading and research will increase in third, fourth, and fifth grade by 5% as measured by PASS.
- All students will increase at least one reading level in the 100 Book Challenge Program.
